

**KNDOP (AFO) - Kentucky No Discharge Operational Permit**  
**For small and medium animal feeding operations (AFO)**  
**Renewed General Permit**  
**Effective 10-1-16; Expires 9-30-21**

This no discharge general permit is for a small or medium AFO that has a liquid animal manure waste handling system. Examples of an affected animal waste handling system include, but are not limited to, a manure storage pit below a hog barn, a holding pond for storage of dairy cow waste, milk house wastewater, and an exposed stack pad for beef manure. An operation not using an agricultural waste handling system or an operation using a dry manure system is not required to obtain coverage under this permit. Examples of dry systems include, but are not limited to, a covered stack pad for beef manure, barn containing horse muck, and chicken house that stores litter. A large AFO that has a liquid animal manure waste handling system is required to apply for an individual KNDOP permit.
